low-resource hospitals in 35 countries.

In this collaboration, RP staff and partners will serve on RAD-AID's multidisciplinary international outreach teams, supporting efforts to improve healthcare for medically underserved communities around the world. RAD-AID and RP will carry out public service and philanthropic medical imaging projects, including on-site radiology education, image-guided procedure demonstrations, patient-safety protocol formulation, equipment planning, technology implementation, radiology administration, remote online educational development, and more.
